COVID-19 Mitigation at Day Camps

Updated 5/28/20

Based on current regulations and recommendations from our state, we are planning to implement the following procedures for day camp. This document is subject to change, and will continue to be updated as both Camp Sunrise and the state make further plans.

Drop-off and Pickup

- Anyone dropping off or picking up campers must remain in their vehicle.
- We will use contactless forms of camper sign-in/sign-out whenever possible.
- Campers will get a health screening and wash their hands during drop-off.

Groups and Social Distancing

- Campers and staff will be split into groups of no more than 20, and those groups will socially distance from other groups throughout the week of camp.
- Each camper will have a separate space to store personal belongings
- Groups will not swim at the same lake at the same time.
- Camp tours or visitors will not be allowed on the site during camp sessions.
- Signage will be posted throughout the facilities regarding COVID-19 symptoms, hand washing, etc.

Enhanced Sanitation

- Facilities and equipment will be sanitized regularly, especially between groups.
- Public bathrooms and frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned at least twice per day.
- Campers will be required to wash their hands during any group restroom breaks, and before and after each meal.
- Our Dining Hall will follow the latest state regulations for restaurant dine-in services. These regulations include seating one group per table and implementing extra safety procedures in the kitchen.

Health Screenings

- Health screenings will be conducted for staff and campers each morning. Campers with a temperature over 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, or with respiratory symptoms or other symptoms of COVID-19, will not be allowed to stay on site.
- Any staff or camper who develops a fever, respiratory symptoms, or other symptoms of COVID-19 while at camp will be separated from the rest of the group and must leave the camp facility as soon as practicable.
- Staff and campers may NOT attend day camp if any of the following apply:
 - They have had symptoms of any sickness in the past 72 hours.
 - They have had a temperature greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, any respiratory symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, etc), chills, muscle pain, sore throat, or new loss of taste or smell in the past 14 days.
 - They have had known contact with a person (including a family member) who has COVID-19 or any of the above symptoms in the past 14 days.
 - They have tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days.
- Staff will be trained on how to identify symptoms of illness in campers, and in the processes for infection mitigation in case a camper does become ill while at camp.
- If a child or staff member gets tested for COVID-19 during their week at camp, or the week before or after, they must agree to share their test results with Camp Sunrise.
